Hello wonderful artists:
As we move toward the busy season ahead, I find myself thinking more about art. Art, the word itself can mean a lot of things to different people. Mention artist and many people conjure up images of a painter wearing a beret, palette in hand,

standing by an easel somewhere on the streets of Paris. Art is so much more than that, is it not? We artists are makers and creators. The pleasures derived from making things has to be the most wonderful feeling in the world. We can get lost in it. British artist, Lucy Sparrow, has made her love of making things into a lucrative business. She has currently taken over a storefront in the East Village in New York City with her latest installment; Feltz Bagels. This is where 30,000 pieces of felt recreate an authentic NYC Jewish bagel shop. Pick a bagel and a schmear, then build your sandwich from there. You order and she will sew it together. She has six types of bagels, and 44 different types of filling.

Unlike galleries in the city with the hands-off rule, Sparrow wants people to interact with her art. The customer creates their own sandwich with as little input from her as possible, almost like their own portrait through the medium of felt food. An array of baked goods line one section and even includes the black and white cookies, Jewish delis are known for. Pickles, peppers, napkins, what else can I add to this array of samples, I can imagine her thinking. (Continued on next page)

#### October Artist of the Month: Marie Picchiotti

Marie Picchiotti, new Art League member and local glass mosaic artist, was voted "Artist of the Month" for October, taking the first prize award during the first meeting of the season October 2nd.



"Shattered But Not Broken"

The large 3 ft. x 3 ft. glass mosaic tile grouted on wood features a pale woman's face with a piercing gaze looking out directly at the viewer from a window framed by green foliage. Picchiotti shared with the League members that she had initially created the piece years before when she was going through an especially challenging, tumultuous period within her life and personal relationship. Marie explained that the face was different in the original artwork, and after moving to Fountain Hills four years ago and unexpectedly finding love again, she "banged out the original face" but left the rest of the mosaic as it was, remaking the face as it currently is. She finished by saying that it's unofficial title is also a reminder to her, "shattered but not broken." Furthermore, due to the highly personal nature of the piece, it will never be sold and will remain within their family collection. Picchiotti's winning artwork will be included in the upcoming League holiday

meeting and potluck to be held on December 4th, where Artists of the Month during the current year are voted on by the membership for the honor of "Artist of the Year."

In a tie for second place was Adi Reinhardt and her sculpture, "Seed Pod for Creativity" and Justine Mantor-Waldie with her painting, "Sunflowers Dancing Around the Trellis."

#### **Summer Project Winner: Mary Ann Grace**

The Fountain Hills Art League chose Mary Ann Grace at their October meeting as the winner of their summer art project.

The summer project theme was "Children" and how they experience life. Artists were allowed to choose whichever medium they wished.

Grace chose to submit her portrait painting "Four Going on Fourteen" of her granddaughter, inspired and influenced, she said, by Norman Rockwell and his mastery of staging people for his artwork. "Sleepovers with the grandchildren when they were young were frequent and my granddaughter, Michaela, loved to play dress up. There are so many special details and memories in this painting for me, too. I wore that pink dress to her parents wedding which made this particularly personal for me, the IOO year old mirror is a family heirloom and the Cabbage Patch doll next to the mirror was her favorite. This painting will now hang in the bedroom of my two great granddaughters."



Each summer League members are invited to create an art project around a specific theme announced at the spring Art League meeting and in the monthly newsletter. Summer projects are brought to the October meeting for voting and the winner receives a small monetary prize. The artist must be present at the October meeting to win but artwork is not eligible for Artist of the Year. In the case of a tie, the monies are split.

## Artist of the Month & Artist of the Year

#### **Eligibility & Submission Requirements**

#### **Artist of the Month**

Each month the Fountain Hills Art League meets we invite our members to bring their artwork to the meeting. First and second place winners receive a ribbon. First place winners are invited to bring their original winning piece to the December potluck. The winning pieces for that year (January - November) are eligible for Artist of the Year.

IMPORTANT: Only current members in good standing (e.g. membership form on file and dues paid) are eligible to submit artwork for Artist of the Month following the requirements below.

**Artist of the Month Submission Requirements:** 

- All art must be original.
- All paintings and photographs must be framed or gallery wrapped with finished sides except for metal prints which are designed not to be framed.
- Subject material for artwork must be from personal photographs or individual creativity, NOT copied from books, magazines or other artist's works.
- If any artwork was worked on in a class or workshop, the instructor could not have TOUCHED the work with any tool or hand.
- The artwork should not have been shown in the Fountain Hills Community Center before.
- An artist can only win first place once during a calendar year.
- Mediums may be painting, photography, or 3-dimensional art.
- We must have at least 3 pieces of art to vote.
- In the event of a tie for 1st place, we will re-vote between the tied pieces for 1st and 2nd place.
- The artist must be present to receive the award.

#### **Artist of the Year**

All first place winners for Artist of the Month and the "People's Choice" winner from the All Member Show are asked to enter their winning artwork for the Artist of the Year competition to be held at the December potluck meeting.

Artist of the Year Submission Requirements:

- The entry must be the original piece of artwork that won for Artist of the Month.
- The artist must be present with their original piece of artwork at the December potluck meeting to receive Artist of the Year.
