
<u>Sharing the 2025 Results!</u>

A big thank you to all of the 2025 Tour d'Artistes members. The tour would not exist without your participation. We had 21 artists this year at 10 Studios/galleries. The attendance ranged from 81 to 173 with an average attendance of 129 people over the three days which was down slightly from last year.

We have \$1,743 in the Student Grant Fund for art supplies for teachers in the Fountain Hills schools. \$1200 is from sponsors, \$450 dollars is from the generous donations of the registration refunds by tour members and \$93 from a raffle at Studio 9.

<u>2024–25 Mini Grant Award Winners Report and Show</u> <u>Their Students' Artwork!</u>

One of the major goals of the Fountain Hills Art league is to provide support for the Fountain Hills School Art Programs. Schools must show evidence of current support for an existing art program to be considered for funding. I am so pleased and delighted to share the results from our 2024-25 Mini Grant Award recipients. The art teachers who received mini grants were Donna Male, Fountain Hills Middle School Art Teacher and Marissa Colon, Fountain Hills High School Art Teacher. Both teachers have done an exemplary job in completing all the requirements identified in the mini grant application. As a result of this, they are both eligible to apply for another mini grant for 2025-26 school year!

Donna Male came out of retirement to carry out the responsibilities of the middle school art program. Her mini grant consisted of a variety of art experiences that contributed to meeting the Arizona Visual Art Standards. Throughout the year she has been able to complete all the expectations of the grant.

The artwork pictured below are evidence of the grant goals she has met! One of the media she chose to explore was that of no-bake ceramic clay. The photos depict that her students excelled in reaching her expectations!



Regretfully, we are sorry to see her return to retirement and can understand that she is eager to enter the next chapter of her life. We know that the district will do their very best in finding an able replacement for Ms. Male!

The mini grant submitted by Marissa Colon, was singularly focused upon students developing technical skills and creative design in stained glass fusion. This area of study would not have been possible for students to experience without the funding from the Fountain Hills Art League. Work in this area requires the purchase of many tools and materials necessary to creative a quality project. These tools and materials allow Ms. Colon to continue to create new experiences in glass and expand her students' expertise!
